Chairman's View

We have a Blueprint

As we stride into the final lap of fence construction for the Aberdares – building the 55 km Extra Section adjoining Mt. Kipiriri – Rhino Ark's blueprint for mountain ecosystem management is being increasingly recognised.

Central to this blueprint concept are three essential ingredients:

- That unlike the temperate zones of the world, mountain ecosystems in tropical zones are both enormously fragile and hugely valuable. Millions of lives depend upon them.
- That as a consequence such ecosystems need serious investment of taxpayer's money to provide them with the legislative and management framework needed to secure them. Equally, taxpayers have a right to demand the political will to ensure this.
- That once secure, their value is principally to conserve watershed and work positively for climate stability.

Have we secured the Aberdares? Nearly, but not quite. We need to finish the construction of the Aberdares fence – and this will happen by October 2009.

We need to finalise the establishment of a Management Trust so that the fence's maintenance is professionally executed, independently financed and is secured by gazettelement.

It needs to be owned by all Kenyans and all Kenyans need to recognise that the fence line communities can be the fence's and ecosystem's most valued guardians.

This is what Rhino Ark has worked tirelessly for since its inception; though twenty years ago, ecosystem threats seemed only to impact upon certain flora and fauna. The reality of human-wildlife conflict was the first sign that population pressures would threaten our resources and that such resources were no longer unlimited. Management of land and the best purpose for which land should be used and, by inference, zoned, acquired 'early warning status' thanks to the Black rhino.

Today society faces the stark reality of appalling mismanagement and lack of planning in the destruction of the Mau Forest, Mt. Eburru and many other forests especially in the past 20 years! But the solutions are there and they are beginning to take centre stage in political thinking. It is harder to make the changes now, and the voices of those who have already exploited these precious assets, even shriller.

But ordinary Kenyan taxpayers, mainly by way of the Rhino Charge, have voiced their expectations. We now need accelerated support from corporate and conservation bodies and from the Kenyan Treasury to secure the Aberdares and all our mountain ecosystems. It is a tribute to the Rhino Chargers that we have come as far as we have and to have developed a blueprint and a way forward with the Aberdares.

Maintenance Expenditure Accelerates

With funding for materials mainly secured from the Treasury for the Kipiriri Extra Section, Rhino Ark's budget allocation for construction in 2009 will be 25% of outlay whilst maintenance will increase to 75% of allocation. Until the Trust is fully operational, Rhino Ark will continue to support the maintenance programme with its management partners, KWS.

Charge Heroes

18 Millionaires lead huge fund raise

The Million Dollar barrier was breached for the second year running despite the hard times – first post – election and then the credit crunch.

18 cars led the millionaire assault. With the help of all 55 entrants who competed in the 2008 Charge a whopping Ksh 63.64 million was banked for Rhino Ark. This figure was lower in shilling terms than last year, but then the shilling was stronger than last year so the aggregate in dollar terms was very close to 2007.

Of the 18 millionaires, 8 broke the Ksh 2 m barrier!

Car 5 – McKittrick/Trundell/Hutchinson/Knight/Jessop & Porter were again unassailable with a massive Ksh 9,393,552 - by far the highest from any car. But this year entrant Alan McKittrick achieved his dream - the grand slam – highest fundraisers, outright winner and Victor Ludorum. Their overall fund raise now climbs to Ksh 46,465,943 - the highest sum ever raised by one vehicle! The spirit of competition runs deep in Car 5 proven by their track record as top fundraisers for eight years and Victor Ludorum veterans for eight years.

Mike and Sarah Higgins of Car 22 took second highest fundraiser for the seventh year running with Ksh 4,261,390. A historic year for Trustee Mike and his staunch team mates, wife Sarah and farm employees Francis Kiluva and John Wainaina, as Mike at 78 announced the retirement of Car 22. His record as a millionaire for 16 continuous years remains unbeaten. The Higgins total now stands at Ksh 39,604,399. Mike and Sarah assured those at Prize Giving that they would remain fully committed to support the Charge and Rhino Ark in the years ahead. After driving the 20 year old Niva Lada farm runabout for 19 of 20 Charges, the Higgins are a testimony to the Spirit of the Charge.

Ben Woodhams (Car 39) leaped up the millionaire ladder taking third highest fundraiser with Ksh 3,536,324, while veteran Sean Avery and Team Bundufundi in Car 38 was hot on his heels in fourth place with Ksh 3,280,993.

Hog Charge team Car 35 of Mark Tilbury comfortably cracked the Ksh 2 million barrier by raising an impressive Ksh 2,962,708. Hog Chargers support for Car 35, now in its 10th year, has raised a total of Ksh 13,691,314. Former Hog Chargers are now in Charge teams and others are pressing for slots!

Hot contenders both in fund raise ability and the event was Car 48 of Mark Glen and Bryn Llewelyn. They raised Ksh 2,038,088 and came second overall. Glen and Llewelyn are looking for top laurels in future Charges.

CFC – supported Car 17 (Rhino Rouge) – an all girls team of Tanya Church, Mary Njonjo, Helle Sejer-Hansen, Colleen Outram, Julie Johnstone and Gemma Lawrence – was the eighth to raise more than Ksh 2 million and for the second year running.

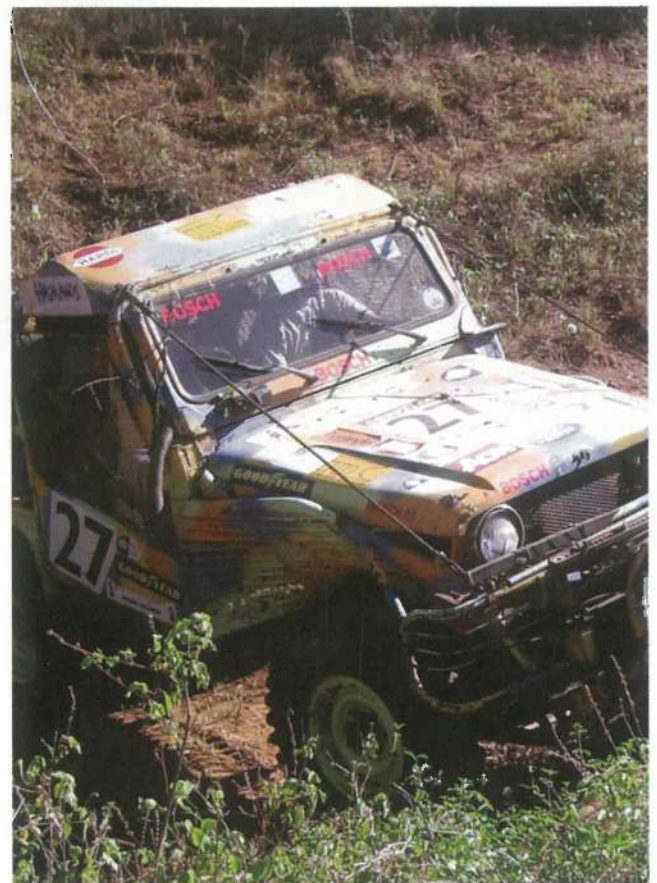
First time millionaire Ravi Patel / Frying Squad team of Car 11 raised a commendable Ksh 1,011,560. The Sapieha sisters in Car 47, formerly driven by their father, achieved an impressive Ksh 1,215,000 as second year millionaires.

Millionaire for the second time and fourth highest overall was James Kelmanson and team in their Unimog Car 1.

32 vehicles met their Ksh 500,000 pledge. Half the number of millionaires doubled their pledge – a commendable achievement from them and their sponsors. They were Mark Glen in Car 48 also the second highest overall, Gai Cullen/Team Fargo of Car 58, Teresa Sapieha's Car 47, Jacques Nell/Team South Africa of Car 31, Michael Kontos in Car 21 and James Gitau Singh in Car 51.

Other first time entrants who fulfilled their half a million pledges were Car 16 – Kamaldeep Phull, Car 60 – Rowena White (an all girl's team), Car 56 – Harveet Obhrai, Car 37 – John Kanyali, and Car 18 – Caroline Armstrong.

Car 41 – Roop Ruparel – was awarded the Spirit of the Charge award for charging with a standard car with no GPS after their charge car failed early on. They managed to complete all 13 guard posts.

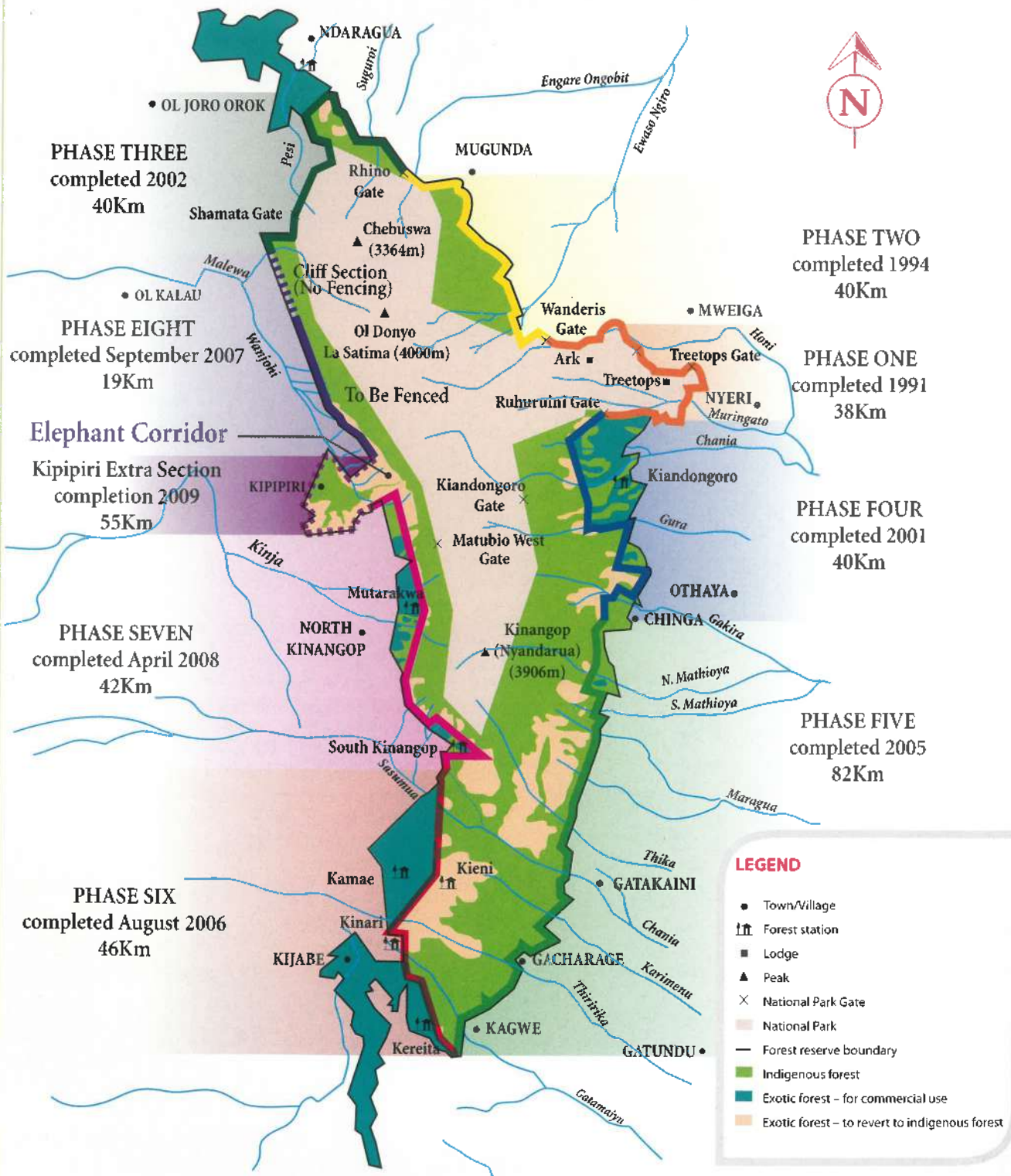

FENCE CONSTRUCTION

Fence will be 400kms long when complete in 2009



Kipipiri: Fence build underway... with community partners

Rhino Ark has now entered the final stage of fence construction.

The Mount Kipipiri Extra Section – estimated at 55 kms in distance – is underway.

This represents a major achievement since it is linked to the main Aberdares by an elephant corridor.

Agreement of the corridor was reached with the Kenya Forest Service (KFS) in February 2008. The area is open grassland with blocks of softwood pine and eucalyptus which will now be harvested. The entire corridor area will remain for indigenous tree re-planting.

Rhino Ark is already active with various forest-edge communities in indigenous re-plant programmes. Such activity complies entirely with the commitment to develop non-exploitive projects inside the fence and with the Forest Act 2005 which stipulates that water catchment zones revert to indigenous.

Construction began in September following mobilisation of materials and a final establishment of the state forest boundary line. KFS completed the survey of the boundary in May/June 2008 with funds provided by Rhino Ark.

At a meeting on July 9 between KFS, KWS and Rhino Ark, it was agreed that the boundary line would be followed. Inevitably as the boundary line contains many changes in direction, the distance for fencing is longer than anticipated.

To date 350 kms of fence have been completed.

Communities donate labour time

Three communities around Kipipiri have committed to help the fence construction providing no cost labour to clear the line and prepare the ground for the fence.

James Githui, Rhino Ark's Fence and Community Manager explained: "The Aberdare fence brings huge benefits to the forest line communities – no more wildlife destruction of crops, no more threats to human life, conservation of the indigenous forest inside the fence and the prospect of a secure environment as well as opportunities to develop non-exploitive forest edge activities and to stop historical exploitive ones".

"We have full buy in from all the Kipipiri Communities. This is good for the long term maintenance and management of the fence line along Mt. Kipipiri".

The resident herds of elephant which move between the main Aberdares and Kipipiri are now secured too.

Kengen Funded Guard Post/Energizer house complete

In 2006 Rhino Ark launched an appeal for guard post donations from business corporations and conservation bodies. So far it has achieved responses from Aggreko (Ksh 4 m), Kengen (Ksh 3 m), Carbacid (Ksh 1.5 m), Kenya Shell (Ksh 1.5 m), US Fish and Wildlife (Ksh 3 m) and Eden Trust (Ksh 0.6 m).

Built to the new KWS standard for field employee accommodation, the buildings provide two bedrooms, a living room, kitchen and ablutions for two fence attendants in each construction. The buildings, complete with verandah, water and power supply (mains or solar), also include an energizer/radio room and storage for fence materials.

Built under the public tender procedure and with professional overseeing by the KWS Technical Department, one guard post was completed at Gakoe in October.

Four guard posts are currently under construction. One is at the Nandarasi River entrance on the main road from Naivasha to the National Park gate at Matubio. Funded by Aggreko, the power supply company, with a Ksh 4 million donation.

The others are at Kiburu, near Njabini/Sasumua Dam (Phase Seven), supported by Kenya Shell at Gatara on Phase Five supported by Eden Trust and at Kereita supported by Carbacid.

Once these are complete a total of 11 permanent guard posts will be operational on the Aberdare fence line. As an essential part of the maintenance plan, the permanent guard posts / energizer houses are required every 20 km. A total of 20 will be required. The need for funds for guard posts is urgently required to ensure that the fence attendants are properly housed to carry out an effective job.

Fence Scouts Training



The first of a series of training workshops for fence scouts took place in June '08. By year-end over 80 scouts will have attended the workshops. The scouts walk the fence line daily. Resource support was provided by Gallagher Power Fencing Company.

EIA Gives Rhino Charge Clean Bill of Health

Rhino Ark is setting up a more formal system to monitor its eco and social footprint at Rhino Charge venues. The aim is to know more scientifically what the impacts are, and to constantly explore ways to ensure the event brings maximum benefit and does no harm.

Environmental care has been a top priority since the Rhino Charge was first designed: it is a major consideration in the selection of venues and it is an ever-present factor in how each course is laid out and in the control of conduct. Diligent post-event reviews, every year for 20 years, have indicated that these measures are highly effective. Recent independent commentary summed it up: "The Rhino Charge is a nomad that walks on eco tip-toe".

This has now been endorsed by a comprehensive Environmental and Social Impact Audit (EIA) at several previous sites in Laikipia, Samburu, Narok and Kajiado, conducted by a team of specialists from the African Conservation Centre and funded by Stanbic.

The team included an ecologist, a plant taxonomist, a socioeconomist and their field assistants. They physically checked for evidence of damage from any and every aspect – access roads, campsites, control points, the passage of competitor vehicles, refuse disposal and all. They interviewed the local communities and examined the status of development projects financed by the Rhino Charge's fees.

Bottom line: there is no evidence that the Rhino Charge event causes significant or lasting damage of any kind; it does deliver substantive development funding.

Rhino Ark Chairman Colin Church said: "These findings are reassuring, but the process of the EIA has done much more than that - it has made us even more aware of our ongoing responsibilities, focused our attention on the very detailed issues of eco measurements, and the links between Rhino Charge and community activities both before and after the event itself. For example, how the temporary access tracks we make,

which would normally grow over in a single wet season, can sometimes be adopted by rangeland management as part of a better road network, or as thoroughfares for the local people. We must consider that while these outcomes are usually positive, they can also become permanent... after we have gone."

In parallel, the study did usefully benchmark the status of the rangeland generally, measuring variations in vegetation density and diversity through both natural forces and community activities, and raised concern on how the development funds provided by Rhino Charge (in good faith and through each community's own leadership structure) were distributed and utilised.

Although the Rhino Charge's core responsibility relates to its own direct impact, during the event itself, Rhino Ark will have to consider to what extent it might assist each venue with its longer-term rangeland health, and systems to ensure the development benefits are democratic and sustained.



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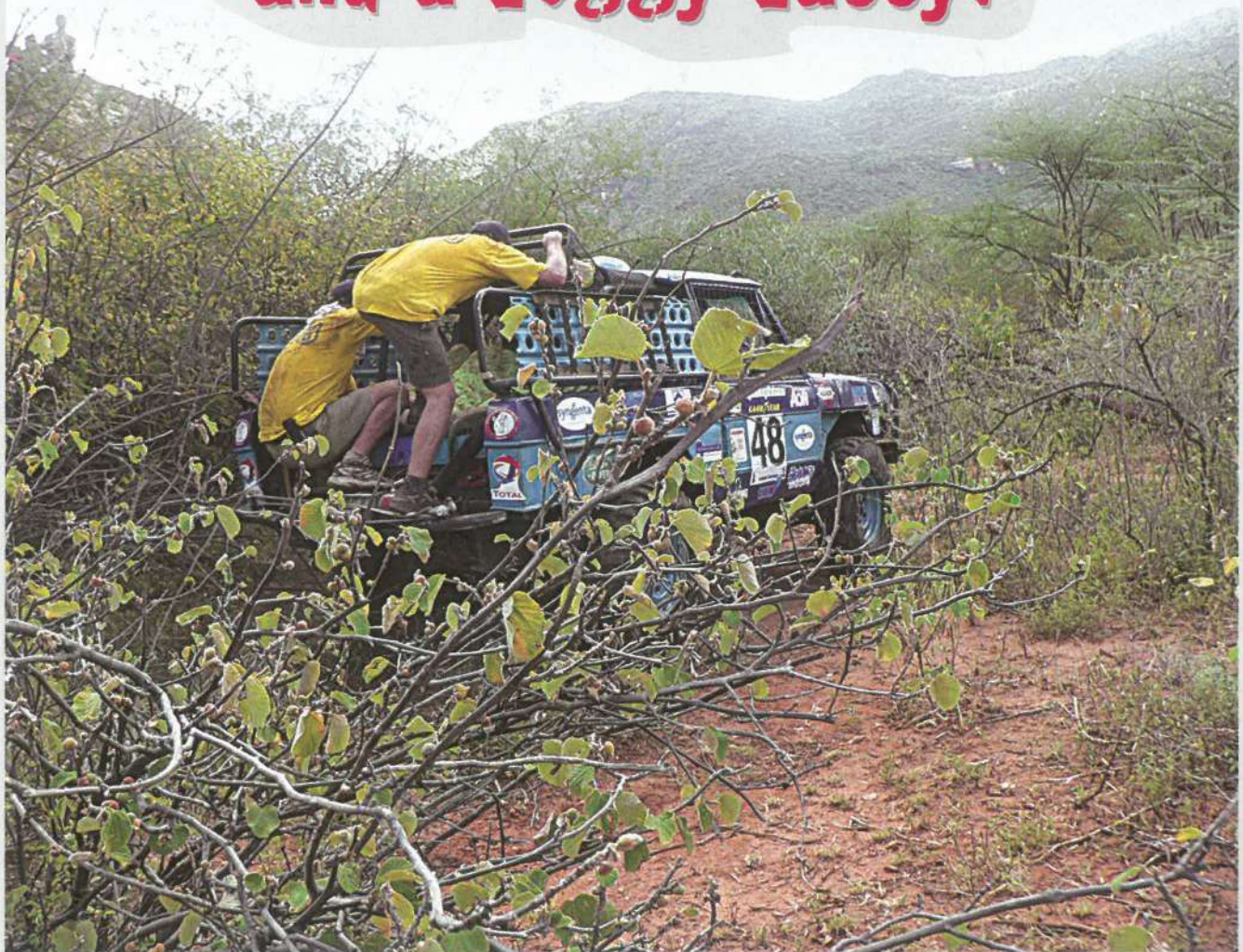
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Car 48 strides to second place.

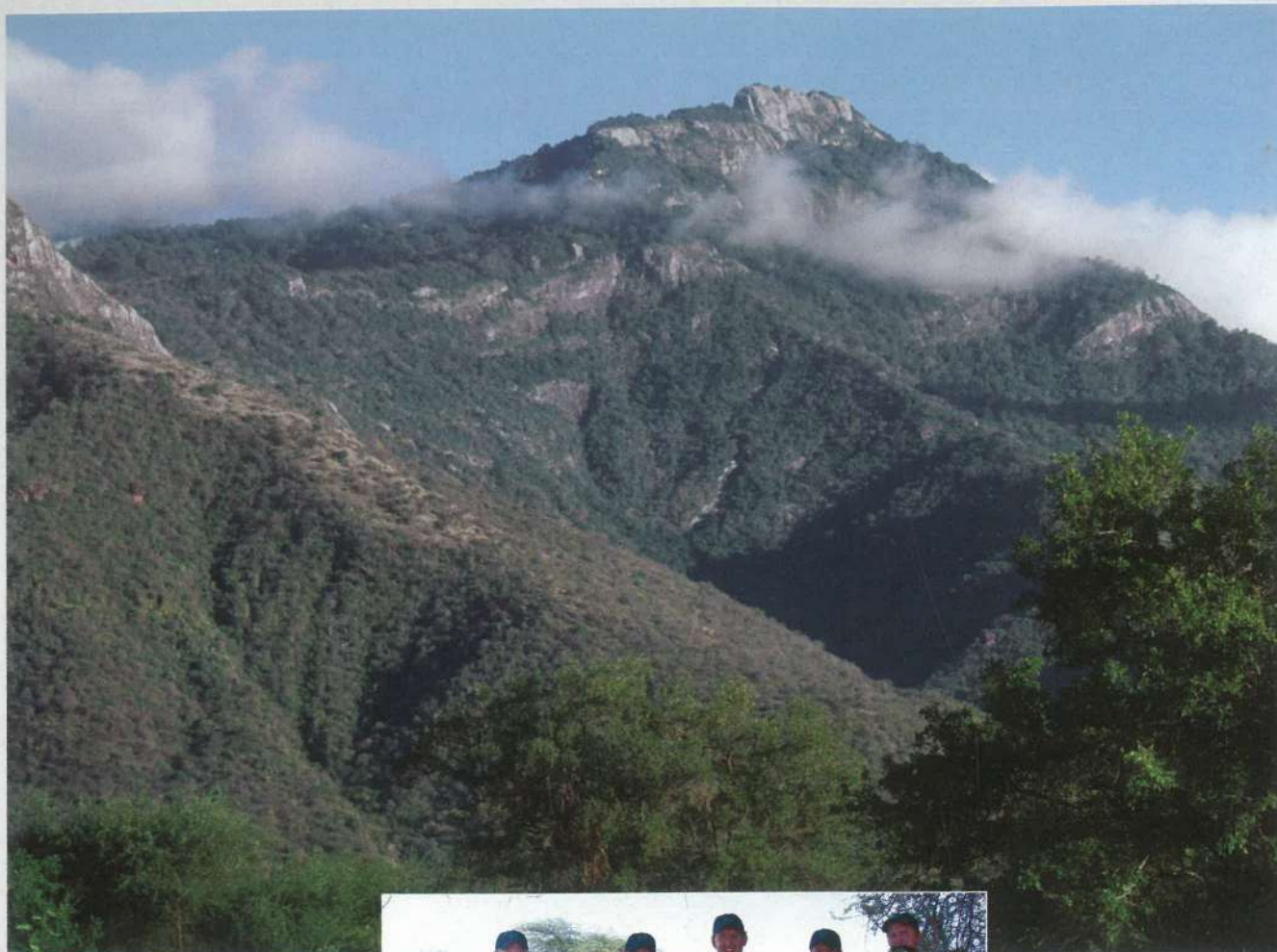
Then onto St. Andrews control with a horrendous engine miss. Despite the odds

Arriving at the Gauntlet Johnny, Steve and Gerard did a superb job at finding us a quick route through the three controls. Our luck was in as two cars stuck in the route just before we gunned into the steep rocky gauntlet cleared out of our way. One of the sections of 50m between Braeburn and Goodyear was down a cliff with boulders. Early cars had winched down it but our nutter drove down as if he did it every day. A truly phenomenal bit of driving.

The next three controls – Land Rover, Brookhouse and KWS were good steady sections with the team working like clockwork. We managed to persuade Land Rover to lend us the spare tyre off their brand new demo/display 2007 Land Rover TDI, so with huge appreciation we yelled "thanks" and roared off.

Arriving at KWS we had caught up a lot of time and were now nearly back on track although this was to be short lived. We met up with our *rafikis* who had the new tyre!

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2008**
1. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below:

- Basis of preparation**
The financial statements summarise the transactions of the Trust and deal with the net assets at the disposal of the trustees. The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost basis of accounting.
- Income recognition**
Donations income is recognised when the monetary value of the donations can be measured with sufficient reliability, there is reasonable assurance of receipt and conditions for receipt, if any, have been met. Investment income is recognised on accrual basis.
- Property and equipment**
Items of property and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation is charged on the straight line basis over the estimated useful lives of the assets.
The annual depreciation rates in use are:
Motor vehicles 25.0%
Furniture and fittings 12.5%
Computers 33.3%
Office equipment 12.5%
- Foreign currency transactions**
Transactions during the year are converted into Kenya Shillings at the rates ruling at the transaction dates. Assets and liabilities at the balance sheet date, which are expressed in foreign currencies, are translated at the rates ruling at that date. The resulting differences from conversion and translation are dealt with in the income and expenditure account.
- Financial instruments**
A financial instrument is a contract that gives rise to both a financial asset of one enterprise and a financial liability of another enterprise. The financial instruments held by the Trust are investments in the money market, trade and other receivables, bank balances and cash and trade and other payables.
All the financial instruments held by the Trust are accounted for on amortised cost basis.
- Receivables**
Receivables are stated at nominal value, less provision for any amounts considered irrecoverable.
- Cash and cash equivalents**
Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash at bank and in hand and short term deposits with an original maturity of three months or less.
- Use of estimates**
The preparation of financial statements requires that the management makes estimates and assumptions that affect amounts reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes. Actual results could differ from these estimates. The more significant estimation process is related to the determination of provision for doubtful debts. Although some variability is inherent in these estimates, management believes that the amounts provided are adequate.

A Record Year

Total funds recorded in our financial statements, together with those received principally from the Kenya Treasury via Kenya Wildlife Service in form of fence building materials, were higher than any previous year.

The total was KShs 116 million in value to the Aberdare fence project.

The 2007 Rhino Charge broke records raising a final audited figure of KShs 69,298,227 equivalent to US\$ 1,000,000.

Corporate /Conservation Bodies Support

Donations from business corporations and bilateral grant supporters continued positively. I would like to record special gratitude to the corporations who responded to our appeal to support the construction of energizer house/guard posts. These included Eden Trust (KShs 0.3 million), Stanbic Bank (KShs 0.7 million) and Kenya Shell (KShs 1.5 million). In addition, Stanbic Bank funded the environmental impact assessment.

The construction of these permanent structures now conform to the new KWS building standards for personnel in the field. Each comprises two bedrooms/living room/kitchen and ablution areas for fence attendants. Construction was advertised under the procurement rules for public tender process. Costs of such quality buildings – bigger in size and with the huge escalation in materials costs and transport than previously planned for, have increased by nearly 100%. Construction will take place during our current financial year.

UNDP Grant for Bongo

A significant grant was received from UNDP for the first time. Under UNDP's Small Grants Programme Compact Project, Rhino Ark is to receive US\$ 50,000 over a two year period starting in September 2007 for the Bongo Surveillance Project. The Bongo Project was awarded the 2007 Michael Werikhe Award for Conservation, provided by the East African Wildlife Society, chosen by the Rhino Charge Committee and announced annually at the Rhino Charge prize giving.

Environmental Audit at Rhino Charge Sites

Our thanks to Stanbic Bank for providing the funds to enable an environmental audit of four recent Rhino Charge sites to be undertaken.

The audit report is available for reading at our Nairobi office. It establishes that Rhino Charge sites quickly revert to their former condition and confirms that considerable care is taken to ensure minimum impact on vegetation occurs. It provides useful insight into the utilization of funds provided by the camping fee and gives suggestions for establishing stronger links with the community groups on whose land the event has taken place.

Fence Building

Work was completed on the 19.2 kilometres of Phase Eight, which was started in March 2007 and 28.6 kilometres of Phase Seven during the year. Thus, I can record that a total of 37.2 kilometres were completed during this financial year. As in 2006, the fence team was hampered by alignment delays and tree-clearing hold-ups due to new Kenya Forest Service (KFS) requirements. This again slowed the pace of construction substantially. Downtime due to the issues mentioned above totalled 12 weeks. It is a shame that such delays are occurring when all funds for materials are enabling us to remain fully stocked and the fence team actually capable of building up to 7 kilometres a month when all conditions combine to work positively.

Treasury support

The response to the *shilling for shilling* call to Treasury continued with a further tranche of KShs 43 million being recorded in fence material receipts for wire/posts and other minor items needed for building the fence. As at 31 March 2008, the Rhino Ark Aberdare project recorded a total of KShs 83 million in material receipts from the Treasury.

As we look to the future, and the establishment of a Trust to manage the fence as a key component in ecosystem management in the Aberdares, we do call for continued Government support and for the gazettement of such a trust thus forming a legal institution for posterity. Rhino Ark's efforts represent civil society commitment to conservation in the Aberdares. But as partners with Government, the fund levels need to match those that have been raised principally from Kenyan tax payers over nearly twenty years since Rhino Ark was established.

Funds Raised in the Year

Gross donations in the year were KShs 73.8 million and include Rhino Charge 2007 with KShs 62.4 million and Rhino Charge 2008 with KShs 4.6 million. Other donations included KShs 1.5 million from Kenya Shell Ltd, KShs 0.7 m from Stanbic Bank and KShs 0.3 million from Eden Trust.

The funds generated by the 2007 Rhino Charge reflect the introduction of the pledge system introduced in 2005 whereby places are secured for KShs 1 million, KSh 500,000 and KShs 200,000 after which the Committee closes the entry list allowing for some entrants having to withdraw due to unforeseen circumstances. The 2007 Charge recorded a total of 56 starters.

The General Fund

The general fund as reflected in the balance sheet has been split into two categories namely; Fence Maintenance Reserve and Fence Construction Reserve. Twenty percent of each year's Rhino Charge donation is allocated specifically for maintenance of the fence already constructed. This is to ensure that the huge amount of effort and money put into the conservation programme does not collapse from lack of maintenance. The maintenance reserve is therefore to earmark these funds for maintenance and not used for construction.

The fence construction reserve had gone into a deficit position of KShs 15.1 million during the year to 31 March 2007. This has improved during the current year and now the deficit has reduced to KShs 6 million. We expect the deficit to be eliminated completely during the year ending 31 March 2009.

Maintenance - Our challenge now

I can report that much time was spent during the year on the formation of a fence management strategy. A document entitled: Aberdare Fence Management Strategy Plan was completed in March 2008. This represents the thinking and detailed financial proposals for fence management by the Kenya Forest Service, the Kenya Wildlife Service and Rhino Ark and with representation from the Aberdare fence line communities. Meetings led by Assistant Director, Mountains of KWS, Maurice Otungah, and Provincial Forest Officer, Fred Ogombe, were held at Rhino Ark's operations base in the Aberdares, Rhino Retreat and at the park's headquarters in Mweiga over a period of nine months.

The document was delivered to the Directors of KWS, KFS and our Board of Trustees for consideration.

During the year 2008, it is hoped that the document's proposals will be thoroughly considered by all those concerned and that the formation of a Trust can move forward to fruition.

Maintenance is Key

I cannot stress enough that when fence construction is complete in 2009, only half the job in the Aberdares will be done.

No project is secured until funds for its permanent maintenance are in place.

Only when maintenance is secured, can we look towards taking on another project. Whatever that may be, Rhino Ark remains committed to the Aberdares and will assist with all matters of environmental management for this precious and vital ecosystem.

Many to Thank

My special thanks must go to all who support this great conservation management initiative – the bi-lateral donors, the corporates and all the Rhino Chargers who continue to be the core fund raising mechanism.

KEKICA Community Tells its Story at Eco-Agricultural Seminar



Members of the KEEKICA community attended a conference in Naivasha on Agricultural, Environment and Climate matters. Chairman of Rhino Ark, Colin Church (fourth right) and the KEEKICA team made presentations as well.

The conference – sponsored by Eco-agriculture Partners in conjunction with Terrafrica, Kenya & Uganda Eco-agriculture Working Groups – touched on the opportunities and challenges of integrating agricultural production, biodiver-

sity conservation and rural development strategies for poverty reduction in East Africa. The conference also highlighted the policies, tools and innovations needed to respond to these challenges.

Eco-agriculture mainly deals with landscape management which conserves biodiversity and ecosystems while also sustainably producing crops, livestock, fish and forests in order to enhance rural livelihoods.

Elephant Grids Funded by Safaricom Foundation

Safaricom Foundation has provided a grant of Ksh 2 million for two elephant grids. One will be at the Kieni-Kamae Road and the other at Nandarasi along the Naivasha to Aberdare National Park Road where the fence crosses the road. This now brings the Foundation's total contribution to Ksh 10 million since 2005.

The elephant grids are usually placed on tarmac roads that pass through forest land. The grid has a bridge-like structure with rolling bars at the top. This rolling activity stops the animal from straying onto farm land.

The grids are to be built to the Ministry of Civil Works standards and supervised by the KWS Technical Unit. Funds for grids at Gakoe and Geta, the road to Wanjoji are needed.

Last year, Safaricom Foundation donated Ksh 4 million to build the elephant corridor section near the Naivasha Road to the park and Mt. Kipipiri.

BLUETRAX SUCCESSFULLY MONITORS TEAMS DURING 2008 RHINO CHARGE

BlueTrax – an advanced GPS satellite vehicle tracking system provided by RiverCross Tracking – enabled spectators in this year's Rhino Charge to monitor the exact location of all competing vehicles, at any time during the event. The system was fitted in all competitor vehicles to enhance competitor safety.

This was a first ever, real time monitoring system used to enhance safety monitoring of the Rhino Charge event. BlueTrax uses the latest automatic vehicle location technology to visually monitor precise vehicle locations.

Spectators were able to request an up-to-the-minute check on their team through the Track-a-Buddy service that BlueTrax offered on site. Frustrations of losing the teams they supported were over.

The GPS tracking system provided each vehicle's movement on the course. BlueTrax made it possible for the Rhino Charge Control Centre to establish the location of all competitors at all times. The tracking system was programmed to send a position update every 15 minutes, displayed on digital maps at the Charge HQ. The software enabled recovery information in case of a breakdown.

The device which was installed on all Rhino Charge 2008 competitor vehicles to enhance the safety of the event and give us data on car movements to spectators.

BlueTrax also had a panic button that allowed competitors to alert the organisers of any emergencies during the event. Fortunately no major emergencies were reported this year.

RiverCross Tracking, providers of the BlueTrax service sponsored half of the units required for the event, with Rhino

Ark sponsoring the balance. The hardware units installed in the car are compact and do not interfere with the vehicle performance.

The service has proved to be of value to commercial fleet managers across the region by introducing new levels of efficiency and control.

'Jumbo Maternities' – in Gatamaiyu / Kereita

Southern Aberdares, just one hour's drive from Nairobi is known for its biodiversity richness and also as a haven for recreation activities like bird watching, camping and guided hiking. With the completion of the Aberdare electric fence, jumbos have now become a common scene in the forest. They can easily be spotted from outside the fence. These giants are known to give birth in specific

locations which are popularly known by the locals as the 'elephant maternities'.

These sites are characterised by large portions of giant fern that the locals believe the bush masters use as a supplement for calcium they require. There are also rivers that run in close proximity – essential for the supply of drinking water and they act as "Swimming pools" for cooling the pachyderms. They

are said to spend three to four weeks in these sites where an average of 10 calves are delivered every season. The jumbos then migrate back into the interior forest where they spend most of their time.

To enjoy this phenomenon, the Kijabe Environment Volunteers (KENVO), a community based organisation has established hiking routes in the forest that visit these sites. In collaboration with a local community group called the AberKenya Ecosafaris, KENVO is developing a community led ecotourism venture including birding, elephant tracking, hiking, home-stays, cultural and agro-tourism.

Mr. Relations Prettejohn of Australia sponsored a special trip to the Salient area of the Aberdares to view the Honi group of bongo. There he captured this beautiful shot of a bongo cow and calf with a hand-held digital camera. This photograph is the second taken of bongo with a hand-held camera. Digital cameras are constantly recording Bongo at various locations. The first hand-held camera photo was by KWS Corporal Nyagah in 2004. Corporal Nyagah and Ranger Langolan tracked a group of about 14 bongo through thick vegetation to get a photo near Rhino Retreat.

Land values up by over 200% – VOA Radio

Voice of America's Sara Nics visited the Aberdares and attended the Rhino Charge at Namunyak, Samburu. This is what she reported.

"The original purpose of the fencing project was to help stop the poaching of the black rhinoceros that live in these mountains. But over the past 20 years, the goal has expanded. Staff at the Rhino Ark, the Kenya Wildlife Service and the Kenya Forest Service came to understand that the Aberdares mountain range is more than a sanctuary for endangered rhino. The rain that falls on the mountains including neighboring Mt. Kenya is the source of five of Kenya's largest rivers. The water that is caught and filtered here irrigates land for many, many miles. The fence prevents people from illegally harvesting the trees that make the Aberdares such a valuable water catchment area."

Sara also highlighted the benefits of the fence to the community as seen from her

interviews: "42-year-old Crispus Karue who has lived and farmed here on the foothills of the Aberdares his entire life, says, "Before the fence, we had a lot of problems with the animals – the elephants, buffaloes, water bucks and the rest. When there was no fence they would come here and destroy our crops and kill our animals like cows, goats; even sometimes they kill people. They would come out from the forest to get food and to eat here."

"Warden Ajuoga says the rate of conflict between humans and wildlife has decreased by about 90 percent where the fence has been built. The property values of neighboring farms have increased by 50 to over 200 percent. More farmers' children are able to go to school since they are no longer needed to guard the fields against wildlife."

But Rhino Ark Chairman, Colin Church says fences are not a solution country-wide: "It's not the solution for wildlife all



over Kenya. We stress it every time: wildlife can not be fenced in everywhere. There are realities that we have to face. One is that we have created an island ecosystem, so there could be long-term challenges."

To address that, Church says the Rhino Ark and the Kenya Wildlife Service are looking for ways to create corridors for elephant and other wide-ranging species. They are hoping to link the Aberdares with its neighboring park, Mt. Kenya, and the open rangelands to the north."

When you mix seven teams of ex-pat Kenyan Bushboys, a bunch of gritty Yorkshire off-roaders, some local school children and their teacher, various other wacky teams and let them loose in the muddy and autumn weather at Pippingford Park in East Sussex for a day, the results are inevitably fun and crazy!

A whopping £12,000 (Ksh 1,608,000) was raised in the 2008 UK Rhino Charge held on Sunday 21st September.

Enthusiastic bands of spectators raised the spirits of the competing teams.

Alan Wormald (Green Sinking Man team) won the event in as much as he had to cope with a failing crankshaft sensor on his Mercedes G Wagon - The Green Sinking Machine. He later had to swap the Mercedes for a Discovery half way through the day to complete the challenge.
