RHINO ARK OBJECTIVES

Rhino Ark seeks solutions to the challenges facing the mountain forest ecosystems of Kenya, also known as the water towers. More specifically, Rhino Ark aims to:

- Protect Kenya's mountain forests, other threatened habitats and their rich biodiversity;
- Engage and educate adjacent communities in conservation;
- Secure the connectivity between mountain forests and other threatened wildlife habitats;
- Establish sustainable financing mechanisms for the conservation of mountain forests and other threatened wildlife habitats;
- Advocate nationally and internationally for the conservation of the mountain forests and other threatened habitats, their wildlife and their ecological functions; and,
- Use science to assess the impacts of, and review conservation interventions.



EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S VIEW

CHRISTIAN LAMBRECHTS

In 2021, our conservation programmes across three mountain forest ecosystems have delivered outstanding outcomes, despite the many challenges resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic. The positive impact of our work highlights the pivotal role that Rhino Ark plays in Kenya's conservation arena. Our work hinges on our fundraising efforts, and this year was exceptional in this respect. Despite the restrictions imposed by COVID-19, we ran the Rhino Charge and hosted over 1,700 persons at the event venue. The success of the family-friendly event re-established momentum and gave assurance that the Charge can be held safely for all participants.

Complementing the Charge, our internal fund-raising team dedicated hundreds of hours to developing and submitting grant applications with very successful results. We received funding from international donors including BIOPAMA, Calgary Zoological Society, Elephant Cooperation, Fresno Chaffee Zoo, Rare Species Conservatory Foundation, Tusk Trust, UNEP African Elephant Fund and the Wildlife Conservation Society. We also passed the first stage in our grant application to the Darwin Initiative. In addition to the many Kenyan corporates who contribute towards our conservation work through the Rhino Charge, funding support was secured from Platinum Credit, IDH/ISLA and the MPESA Foundation. We also received material to build 60 kilometres of comprehensive fence in Mt. Kenya thanks to the largest single in-kind contribution ever made to us, from the Upper Tana Natural Resources Management Project (Ministry of Water, Sanitation and Irrigation / IFAD).

The success of our fundraising efforts owes much to the credibility and visibility we have gained through high performance in implementing our conservation activities.

Major strides have also been made on the Public Relations and media front. Over 50 articles and news items were published about Rhino Ark and the Rhino Charge. Many of these were related to the Rhino Charge, representing the most extensive coverage of the event since its inception. We were also featured in highly-regarded international magazines, including Forbes and Fodor.

In the field, in addition to maintaining our existing fencing and community conservation programmes, we established new initiatives: a bongo conservation programme (Ragati forest); two elephant grids (Imenti forest); a beekeeping cooperative (Eburu forest); developing community-based firefighting capacity (Eburu forest); and improving firefighting preparedness (Aberdares and Mt. Kenya), among others.

The dedication of our supporters, partners and friends has been essential to our continued success in the conservation of Kenya's water towers. To all of you, once again, a big thank you.

Rhino Ark fully offsets the event's carbon footprint by purchasing Certified Emission Reductions (CERs) which go towards UNFCCC certified projects that reduce, avoid or remove greenhouse gas emissions from the atmosphere.

The Rhino Charge is primarily volunteer run. The Main Organising Committee consists of 11 members. They plan the event year round and spend up to 2 weeks on site before and after the Charge. Onsite at the event another 60+ volunteer Officials give their time and expertise to ensure the smooth running of the event. Volunteers not only donate time, but considerable resources which help reduce the overall costs of the event.

As the Rhino Charge is the guest of the host community, whilst on recce much of the Main Organising Committee's time is spent building understanding with the host community. They also spend time finding and designing the route, plus planning how to provide good camping for up to 3,000 people, including planning water provision, medical facilities, airstrips and other key parts of the event.

4-5 AIRCRAFT



Search and Rescue on venue typically consists of:

- 4-5 Aircraft including fixed wing planes, helicopters and gyrocopters,
- 4-5 Cars in strategic positions,
- Team @ HQ monitoring positions of cars and co-ordinating with S&R Team over the radio.

The S&R team remains on duty until all people have been safely accounted for and recovered. At Nannapa Conservancy, the S&R team ended their shift at 4am in the morning after the Charge. Stuck, lost or broken vehicles are often recovered the next day.

RHINO ARK KENYA CHARITABLE TRUST NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2021

1. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below:

(a) Basis of preparation

The financial statements summarise the transactions of the Trust and deal with the net assets at the disposal of the Directors. The financial statements are presented in Kenya Shillings (KES), which is the Trust's functional and presentation currency.

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost basis of accounting except where otherwise stated in the accounting policies below.

(b) Income recognition

Donations and Rhino Charge collections are recognised on receipt. Investment income is recognised on accrual basis.

(c) Property and equipment

Items of property and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation is charged on the straight line basis over the estimated useful lives of the assets.

The annual depreciation rates in use are:

Motor vehicles	25.0%
Furniture and fittings	12.5%
Computers	33.3%
Office equipment	12.5%

(d) Foreign currency transactions

Transactions during the year are converted into Kenya Shillings at the rates ruling at the transaction dates. Assets and liabilities at the reporting date, which are expressed in foreign currencies, are translated at the rates ruling at that date. The resulting differences from conversion and translation are dealt with in the income and expenditure account.

(e) Financial instruments

A financial instrument is a contract that gives rise to both a financial asset of one enterprise and a financial liability of another enterprise. The financial instruments held by the Trust are investments in the money market, trade and other receivables, bank balances and cash and trade and other payables.

All the financial instruments held by the Trust are accounted for on amortised cost basis.

(f) Receivables

Receivables are stated at nominal value, less provision for any amounts considered irrecoverable.

(g) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash at bank and in hand and short term deposits with an original maturity of three months or less.

(h) Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements requires that management makes estimates and assumptions that affect amounts reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes. Actual results could differ from these estimates. The more significant estimation process is related to the determination of provision for doubtful debts. Although some variability is inherent in these estimates, the management believes that the amounts provided are adequate.

(i) Investments

Investments are held in the money market with Old Mutual and Britam asset managers. Interest is earned on a monthly basis from these placements and rolled over as principal.

(j) Payables

Payables are stated at nominal value.

2. IMPACT OF COVID 19

Following the postponement of the 2020 Rhino Charge, Rhino Ark's main fundraising event, due to Covid-19, Rhino Ark adopted a wide-range of cost-saving measures and embarked on an extensive fundraising programme. This helped sustain Rhino Ark's operations and the maintenance of its legacy projects. However, Rhino Ark had to use the reserve it had built over several years. Rhino Ark, therefore, reported a deficit from operations of KES 50,596,868 (2020: KES 24,797,039) and as at that date, the current assets exceeded its current liabilities by KES 14,546,425 (2020: KES 58,068,180). The Rhino Charge event took place in July 2021 and as of the date of the event a total of KES 81.68 million had been collected by the organization from the fundraisers.

18. LEGAL FORM

Rhino Ark Kenya Charitable Trust was established in 1991 under an irrevocable trust in accordance with the Laws of Kenya.

19. TAXATION

The Trust has been granted exemption from taxation under the First Schedule to the Kenyan Income Tax Act (Cap 470) under Certificate number 20170214/11869 dated 14 February 2017 valid for 5 years.

20. CURRENCY

The financial statements have been presented in Kenya Shillings (KES).



2020 has been a year unlike any other. For the first time in Rhino Ark's history, the annual Rhino Charge, which is a main fundraising event was cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The cancellation of the Rhino Charge led to a massive reduction in expected core funding. To address this situation, the organisation adopted far-reaching cost-saving measures and revised programme of works with a focus on maintaining legacy projects, in particular the 650 kilometres of conservation electrified fences built to date, and on strengthening our community forest patrols.

Although the pandemic is far from over, some initial lessons have been learned. COVID-19 has highlighted the importance of having a wide and diverse fraternity supporting the organisation's cause. Broadening sources of funding is a critical strategic objective that directors have been pursuing for a number of years to reduce vulnerability to a changing socio-economic environment.

Overall funds 2020/21

The total funds raised during the financial year under review were KES 92.61 million. This included in-cash donations amounting to KES 63.28 million (2020: KES 189.82 million) from Rhino Charge, Corporates, individuals and other donors and in-kind donations amounting to KES 29.33 million, from the Government, various corporates and individuals.

Due to COVID-19 pandemic, the 2020 Rhino Charge event was postponed and finally cancelled.

KWS covered the costs of the personnel maintaining the 400 km Aberdare Fence and the 215 km Mt. Kenya Fence already built while Kenya Forest Service (KFS) covered such costs for the 43.3 km Eburu Fence. These contributions amounted to KES 25.8 million.

Corporate/conservation bodies support

Even though the Rhino Charge did not take place, we received contributions from the following corporate / conservation bodies who Rhino Ark would like to thank:

- M-Pesa Foundation for donating KES 3.1 million for tree nurseries project;
- Calgary Zoo for donating KES 1.9 million in support of the conservation of the Mountain Bongo antelope;

- Eburu Rafiki for donating KES 2.48 million in support of grassroots education outreach. This includes funds from African Fund for Endangered Wildlife (AFEW) amounting to KES 1 million, KES 0.69 million from Florensis Kenya, KES 0.79 million from The Safari Collection and several other donors;
- IDH Sustainable Trade Initiative (IDH) for donating Euro 12,555 for the activities at South West Mau Forest Reserve;
- Wildlife Conservation Society for donating USD 44,955 for addressing human-wildlife conflicts (building of elephant grids) in the Imenti Forest;
- Elephant Cooperation, through the Bill Woodley Mt Kenya Trust, for donating USD 18,000 for addressing human-wildlife conflicts (building of elephant grids) in the Imenti Forest;
- Platinum Credit for donating USD 29,264 for the establishment of micro-fences and replanting of 10 hectares of degraded forest in South Western Mau Forest Reserve;
- UNEP-African Elephant Fund for donating USD 37,000 towards addressing the illegal killing of elephants in the Imenti Forest;
- Tusk Trust Limited donating USD 50,000 for forest security and salary support at Eburu & Aberdares and donating USD 46,767 for a community fire-fighting brigade and community conservation champion programme at Mau Eburu Forest;
- Rare Species Conservatory Foundation for donating USD 40,000 in support of the conservation of the Mountain Bongo antelope.

In-kind contributions were also made by corporates in support of the Trust and the Rhino Charge, and the contributors of KES 3.29 million are detailed here below:

- Gallagher Power Fence Systems: KES 1.04 million;
- Fire extinguishers donated: KES 0.28 million;
- Flamingo Horticulture Kenya Ltd: KES 1.018 million;
- Dedan Biogas Ltd: KES 0.48 million;
- James Finlays (Kenya) Ltd: KES 0.469 million.

Wider Mau Eburu conservation

Close engagement with forest edge communities continued to be a cornerstone of Rhino Ark's conservation approach. Communities are directly benefitting from sustainable livelihood initiatives support.

The biogas project has seen 57 farms install biogas units and transition out of charcoal and firewood as their main domestic energy sources. These farmers are also benefitting from the use of bio slurry (a biogas by-product) as an organic fertilizer for use on their farms and kitchen gardens. The training received by the farmer groups and their practical experience were also shared with groups in neighbouring counties.

Rhino Ark supported training of farmers on water harvesting systems to address

the perennial problem of surface water availability. From this training and logistical support, 16 farms have so far built water pans with dam liners. This initiative is contributing to improved farm productivity.

Rhino Ark, with support from KENCHIC Ltd. introduced forest edge farmers to the hardy KENBRO chicken breed and provided training and ongoing technical support. The Eburu Fruit Farmers, one of the community groups, has grown their initial stock of 100 chicks at inception in 2019 to 1,440 birds to date.

Rhino Ark, organizes regular training modules for farmers on fish, poultry, dairy and pyrethrum farming, as well as organic farming methods, fertilizer use and marketing. The training sessions are conducted by experts from the agriculture ministry and from the private sector. Benchmarking trips (Karura Forest/ governance, and Lengetia Farm, Naro Moru (best practices) have also been organized for selected famers' groups.

Rhino Ark has teamed up with the Calgary Zoo through the Mountain Forest Conservation Partnership to conduct surveys as part of continued support to the communities surrounding Eburu Forest towards establishing a commercial grade honey production facility. As part of this process, a total of 1,083 community beehives have been accurately mapped within the forest using GIS.

Since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic in Kenya, the team has recorded an increase in illegal forest activities at Eburu Forest. This challenge has been met with an increased work effort through forest foot patrols and intelligence work. The collaboration between the Bongo Surveillance Project, Eburu Rafiki, Kenya Forest Service, Kenya Wildlife Service and Calgary Zoo and Rhino Ark has greatly improved forest security. Monitoring of mountain bongo and other wildlife in the forest has been ongoing through a grid of 13 active trap cameras.

Maintaining the Eburu Electrified Fence is a continuous process that requires deep commitment by a dedicated 12-man team backed up by the fence technical committee. An upgrade of the 43.3km long fence was undertaken involving the installation of "W" plastic insulators on all plastic fence posts, thereby increasing voltage by up to 2 kilovolts.

Landslides in Eburu Forest cut off over 20,000 community members from water access, damaging three water infrastructure systems on which they rely. Rhino Ark facilitated assessment of what is required to restore these critical water systems in Kahuho and Ole Sirwa.

South Western Mau ecosystem

Rhino Ark's community conservation work initiated in 2017 has resulted in communities benefitting from honey production training in 2018/19 enabling the development of conservation-based livelihoods amongst the community. A review of the beehives inventory in the

community is ongoing, with 592 hives recorded so far. Rhino Ark continues to provide technical support to the beekeepers.

An initiative to develop a forest herbal products business programme is underway. An initial training module was conducted for 16 interested community members.

Our robust community conservation programme continued to grow, with regular community outreach meetings held. Among the target groups has been local churches, and this approach has been effective. With Rhino Ark support, eight churches across the landscape have each established tree nurseries as livelihood initiatives and to support forest rehabilitation. The churches are instrumental in providing a platform to reach the wider community.

Despite the interruption occasioned by Covid-19, the schools conservation education programme continued with 46 local schools participating. Our sustainable energy programme, embedded within 15 local schools, progressed well. The schools are effectively using energy saving Jikos (stoves) and charcoal making kits for cooking, thereby reducing their fuelwood consumption by up to 50%.

Nine community members across the ecosystem have been recruited into the conservation champions' programme. These champions received relevant conservation and sustainable livelihood training and took lead in local Rhino Ark conservation work. Their contributions were recognized by other partners who often requested them to assist in their conservation activities.

Snaring of wildlife in the expansive South Western Mau Forest was an ongoing challenge, as well as logging and charcoal burning particularly in the wake of the Covid-19 pandemic. Towards mitigating these challenges, Rhino Ark participated in regular joint forest patrols with Kenya Forest Service rangers, three community scouts and Conservation Champions.

Under the aerial surveillance programme, Rhino Ark coordinated two flights during the reporting period. All key stakeholders participated in the flights, including a member of the Judiciary. The surveillance flights are an invaluable tool in enhancing forest protection, and provide a critical forum for key stakeholders to collectively address forest security threats.

In collaboration with Kenya Forest Service, Rhino Ark continued to maintain 40 hectares of rehabilitated forest at Kipkoris outpost along the eastern forest boundary. A team of three community scouts carries out spot weeding, seedling infilling, and prevention of livestock grazing at the site.

Mt. Kenya fencing project

A milestone in the construction of the Mount Kenya Electric Fence has been reached with the signing of a funding agreement for the Mt Kenya Fence amounting to KES 267 million. This includes the construction of 60 km of comprehensive fence; three energizer

houses; 20 gates; four elephant grids; and two years of maintenance. This is the largest single funding ever secured by Rhino Ark.

Despite the economic impacts of Covid-19, fence construction continued, albeit at a slower rate. 215 kilometres of the 450 kilometers comprehensive fence that will eventually encircle Mount Kenya have been completed. However, the fence construction was relocated to build a 10 kilometre fence between the forest reserve and Mount Kenya Wildlife Conservancy. The fence requires regular maintenance and, to that end Rhino Ark and KWS has a team of fence supervisors and fence attendants that monitor and fix the damages to enable the full functionality of the electric fence built so far in Mt. Kenya.

With the support of the Wildlife Conservation Society and the Elephant Cooperation, Rhino Ark started building two elephant grids at Ruiri and Kithoka in the Imenti Forest to prevent elephants from exiting the forest through the main road. In addition, Rhino Ark secured support from the African Elephant Fund to build a low fence with outriggers parallel to the main electric fence, in an area where fence breakages by elephant had become a major challenge. 23 kilometres of low fence have been built.

Rhino Ark, Mount Kenya Trust, Mount Kenya Conservation Forum and the Kenya Forest Service have joint efforts towards taking advantage of the current rains to replant former commercial forest plantation areas and degraded natural forest areas. Community involvement in the exercise makes them own the initiative and, in the end, they help in nurturing the growth of the trees and protect the forest zones. Degraded forest areas were replanted in Ontulili, Gathiuru and Kabaruru forest stations

Aberdares ecosystem

Protecting the precious but fragile ecosystem of the Aberdares needs constant fence maintenance to deter poachers, illegal loggers, and charcoal burners and forest encroachment but largely to protect forest-adjacent communities from marauding wildlife. Rhino Ark continued financing the maintenance of the 400-km-long Aberdare fence, as a priority area.

Fence maintenance is one of the areas of responsibility of the Aberdare Trust, and among the financing options for Rhino Ark is the partnership with Powering Africa-Recharging Conservation (PARC). PARC creates technologically innovative and economically viable solutions to open up access to clean energy and secure long-term funding for conservation projects that protect the environment and promote climate change resilience in rural areas in Africa. PARC, in turn, secures funding from investors who are not just driven by financial returns, but also wish to provide long-term funding for conservation. Two potential hydro-power projects of 7.8 and 6 MW have been identified in the landscape that could generate substantial revenue for fence maintenance.

With support from Tusk Trust, Rhino Ark strengthened the operations of the community scouts of the Aberdare Joint Surveillance Unit (AJSU). Founded in 2010, this partnership between forest-adjacent communities, Rhino Ark, Kenya Forest Service and Kenya Wildlife Service, sought to involve more actively forest-adjacent communities in conservation efforts. Today, the Unit is at the forefront of conservation. Fully trained and equipped, AJSU carries out many tasks, including: forest patrols, detection of illegal activities, arrests, destruction of charcoal kilns and marijuana crops, and removal of snares and traps. AJSU also conducts regular assessment of the status of the 400-kilometre-long fence around the Aberdare ecosystem.

The heavy rainfall in 2020 led to numerous landslides destroying 2,195 kilometres of fence. Despite this challenge and the prevalent financial constraints caused by COVID-19, Rhino Ark succeeded in repairing these damages and ensuring the continuation of the protective functions of the fence in these areas.

With the support of Agricultural Extension and Marketing Services, a forest mulcher was imported to Kenya to clear firebreak in the Aberdares and Mt. Kenya. A trial run of 3 kilometres was made that demonstrated the efficacy of the equipment.

Bongo Surveillance Project (BSP) successes

Rhino Ark remains a key partner and supporter of the Bongo Surveillance Project, raising the bulk of the funds for the project and seconding a conservation education officer to the project.

USD 40,000 was received during the year from Rare Species Conservatory Foundation. The funds go towards collecting vital information about the Bongo, patrols, removal of snares and spear traps, as well as to the dynamic Bongo wildlife school outreach programmes under BSP.

Thousands to thank

It is always difficult to express gratitude to all who deserve a vote of thanks in a report like this. Rhino Ark has thousands of donors in Kenya and friends overseas who support the home-grown and home-driven conservation initiative. I wish to especially mention the Chargers, some of who were able to secure and remit sponsorships to Rhino Ark despite the cancellation of the Charge event.

I thank all of you for your generous support.

I wish to especially thank the Rhino Charge Committee and the huge band of volunteers who planned two different charge venues in the hope that the 2020 edition of the event would take place.

COLIN CHURCH, OBE

28th January 1940-16th March 2021

Colin was an inspirational figure for us all at Rhino Ark with the vision to take on the project from its founder, Ken Kuhle, and serve as Chairman of the Management Committee for 12 years. Perhaps his greatest achievement in the lifetime of the project was the completion of the Aberdare fence and its commissioning by President Mwai Kibaki and Prime Minister Raila Odinga in 2009. He also witnessed the complete fencing of Mount Eburru, another key moment in the history of Rhino Ark.

It was under Colin's stewardship, too, that the Rhino Charge grew and prospered, becoming an essential fundraising tool for the entire project.

Colin will be remembered as one of Kenya's greatest conservationists devoted to his beloved Aberdares, which he described in his book, *Mel-el-Iek's Mountain*, published in 2019. Recognized internationally for his services to conservation by the award of the OBE by Her Majesty the Queen in 2018, he also served as Chairman of the Kenya Wildlife Service. In recent years, he was on the Board of Trustees of the Mara Elephant Project, before being appointed Chairman.




PHILIP HECHLE

RHINO ARK'S POSITIVE IMPACT ON FOREST EDGE COMMUNITIES

A visit to Kenya by the President of the 75th Session of the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) Mr. Volkan Bozkir, gave Rhino Ark an opportunity to showcase the impact of our conservation work to a high-level local and international audience.

Four community members drawn from mountain forest ecosystems in which Rhino Ark operates made brief presentations about how Rhino Ark's fence and sustainable livelihoods support projects have had positive impacts on their lives. The members, whose ages spanned three generations, spoke passionately about how the resolution of human-wildlife conflict through Rhino Ark's conservation projects had greatly improved their lives.

Maseto Kusen, 49, an ethnic Ogiek community member from Eburu Forest spoke of how better security in the forest and training on beekeeping skills by Rhino Ark had helped

him achieve a 500 per cent increase in his forest beehive stock, with the improved earnings enabling him to sustain his family and pay for the education of his children.

Salim Ibrahim, 65, from Imenti in Mt. Kenya, a survivor of a horrific elephant attack, described how his home area was now free of the human-wildlife conflict that bedevilled the area before the Rhino Ark fence project.

Peter Kibuka, 72, from Bondeni in the Aberdares demonstrated the transformative impact of the fencing project, which made it possible for farmers to reap increased yields. Land value in the area rose by up to 300 per cent after the fence was erected.

Margaret Nduta, 12, from Bondeni said her generation had developed a keen interest in the conservation of nature. They can now go to school without the fear of being attacked by wild animals, and participate in Rhino Ark-

facilitated conservation activities.

The Cabinet Secretary for Environment and Forestry, Keriako Tobiko, Kenya Forest Service Chairman Peter Kinyua and the Chief Conservator of Forests Julius Kamau were among the dignitaries who graced the event and took note of the testimonies from the community members.

The positive feedback from the dignitaries once again underscored the critical role that Rhino Ark's conservation and community interventions continue to play in Kenya's mountain forest ecosystems.

I am a trained mason but I have since abandoned the construction industry to embark on farming of tree tomatoes because my farm is now secure. Because of the electric fence, there is assurance of reaping my harvest now that wildlife no longer come to my farm. I produce the juiciest tree tomatoes free of pesticides."

EBURU COMMUNITY FOREST ASSOCIATION OFFICE COMPLETED

The construction of the Eburu Community Forest Association (CFA) Office in the main forest station is now complete. Rhino Ark is supporting the CFA in the hiring of a local receptionist to work with tourists, sell guidebooks and help connect visitors with local tour guides to boost tourism in the area.

JOINT SECURITY FORUM BOOSTS TEAM COLLABORATION

The biannual Eburu Forest security meeting is a crucial forum that brings together all frontline teams of rangers from the Kenya Wildlife Service, the Bongo Surveillance Project Trackers, the Rhino Ark Fence Maintenance team, officials from the local administration and the Community Forest Association.

One of the primary goals of these meetings is to build trust and open lines of communication between the various squads responsible for the different elements of security in the forest and Eburu Forest Reserve.

Rhino Ark conducts joint forest security patrols at Eburu Forest with the Kenya Wildlife Service and the Bongo Surveillance Project. Inclement weather in the highland forests did not stop our motivated field teams from getting out and conducting extensive forest security and snare removal patrols.

EBURU BEEKEEPERS RECEIVE TRAINING

Rhino Ark in partnership with The Calgary Zoo organised a one-week training for Eburu beekeepers at the National Beekeeping Institute in Nairobi. The training was carried out from 26th September to 1st October 2021.

Eighteen members drawn from nine user groups and seven individual beekeepers in Eburu Forest attended the training. Rhino Ark, with support from The Calgary Zoo, facilitates such training programmes to help forest adjacent communities improve their livelihoods with activities like beekeeping to reduce pressure on the forest.

Eburu beekeepers are currently in the process of registering a cooperative. Once registered, the group will be referred to as the Eburu Natural Forest Honey Cooperative Society Limited.

Lessons learned will equip members with diverse knowledge on bee species, their pests, diseases and predators and how to control them. Other skills learned include colony management, honey harvesting, processing, packaging and marketing, honey quality analysis and customization of hives (insulators) to make them more suitable for bees. The beekeepers will also be able to undertake the cost/benefit analysis of their enterprises.

SCHOOLS BENEFIT FROM RHINO ARK'S TREE NURSERY

Rhino Ark has signed a Community Agreement Contract with nine primary schools paving the way for better governance of school tree nurseries.

Community contracts are schemes created by Rhino Ark to provide a framework for benefit sharing programmes carried out by wildlife clubs in schools and other community-based organisations that receive support from Rhino Ark. Beneficiary groups sign the contracts voluntarily to ensure maximum effectiveness in project implementation.

SOUTH WESTERN MAU ECOSYSTEM

PLATINUM CREDIT JOINS FOREST REHABILITATION EFFORTS

Platinum Credit Ltd has partnered with Rhino Ark to support the rehabilitation of the South-Western Mau Forest. Platinum has undertaken to rehabilitate 10 hectares of indigenous forest at Kapkembu, the southernmost outpost along the eastern forest “cut line” boundary. The Kapkembu area impacts the Mara ecosystem as it forms part of the upper catchment of the Mara River system.

The area suffered heavy degradation until 2009 due to encroachment. Once a prime indigenous forest, it had been decimated and turned into farmland. On 21st May 2021, the journey towards the rehabilitation of Kapkembu commenced with the planting of 11,000 seedlings. Members of the local community, led by the Ogiek Council of Elders head Joseph Barno and area chief David Busienei joined the staff of Rhino Ark, Platinum Credit and Kenya Forest Service in the tree planting effort.

Rhino Ark has expressed its gratitude to Platinum Credit Ltd, a subsidiary of the Platcorp Holdings Company, for supporting the rehabilitation work at Kapkembu. Platinum's support will span a critical three-year period of the maintenance necessary to nurture the seedlings until they take root and thrive.

PUPILS HIKE IN THE FOREST

South-Western Mau Forest is emerging as a destination for recreational hiking. A group of 74 pupils and eight staff from St. Andrew's School, Turi (Molo) in September 2021 visited the South-Western Mau Forest for a nature hike in the Chepkoburot zone of the Ndoinet Forest block. Our conservation efforts are enhancing the profile of the forest to a wider audience.

It was the first such recreational hike in the forest. The Rhino Ark team in collaboration with the Ndoinet Forest manager planned the hike. The St. Andrews group was split into two teams, with one team walking a longer forest trail for three and a half hours and the other group taking that shorter trail that took one and half hours to complete. Rhino Ark and the Kenya Forest Service staff accompanied both teams.

The hike enabled the pupils to observe the natural forest and rivers, experience the impact of degradation and appreciate the need for rehabilitation.

EMPOWERMENT OF FOREST EDGE RESIDENTS THROUGH BEEKEEPING

Commercial honey production has the potential to transform communities. In Kenya, approximately 25,000 metric tons of honey worth \$40.4 million are produced annually. The sector employs 91, 000 people directly while supporting the livelihoods of over 500,000 people.

Rhino Ark is at the forefront of efforts to boost the incomes of forest-edge communities through a bio-enterprise programme that is strengthening modern beekeeping in Eburu and South-Western Mau.

Through the beekeeping programme, Rhino Ark is heeding the call of the United Nations, which through a General Assembly resolution, has encouraged countries to increase the capacity of local communities to pursue alternative livelihoods in an effort to minimize the illegal wildlife trade.

MT. KENYA ECOSYSTEM

PILOT ELEPHANT SURVEY THROUGH CAMERA TRAPS

Rhino Ark is carrying out a Camera Trap Survey of elephants along the Imenti Fence line in Mt Kenya with support from the United Nations Environment Programme and the African Elephant Fund. The study is aimed at identifying elephants that have developed the habit of fence breaking. The habitual fence breakers breach the barrier even when it is powered above the recommended 5,000 volts.

Our field teams deployed the camera traps in the fence breakage hotspots and surveillance is currently underway. At Kithoka in Imenti, two elephant bulls have already been identified. One bull meticulously pushes down the fence post using its tusks and proceeds to either uproot or break the post depending on the ground substrate. It then steps over the fallen post to freely exit the forest and raid crops on forest-edge farms.

ELEPHANT GRIDS CONSTRUCTED AT KITHOKA AND RUIRI

Rhino Ark with support from Wildlife Conservation Society and Elephant Cooperation is constructing Elephant Grids at Kithoka and Ruiri. The two sites are the points at which the Meru-Ruiri road cuts through the Mount Kenya Electric Fence at Imenti Forest Reserve.

In recent elephant surveys, researchers reported that the Imenti Forest hosts the highest density of elephants out of the 2,600 elephants recorded in Mt Kenya National Park and Forest Reserve. The higher

elephant population at Imenti is the cause of an increased rate of human-elephant conflict in the forest-adjacent communities.

The Mount Kenya Electric Fence held the elephants at bay for a while until the pachyderms learnt how to exit the forest through the tarmac road dissecting Imenti Forest.

The elephant grids are wildlife barriers aimed at preventing elephants from exiting the forest while allowing free human and vehicle movement.

UNEP'S AFRICAN ELEPHANT FUND SUPPORTS BEEKEEPING IN LOWER IMENTI

With support from UN African Elephant Fund, Rhino Ark organised a training session on beekeeping at Lower Imenti Forest Station and Maili Kumi (Buuri Beekeepers).

Central Beekeepers, a Kenyan company with hands-on experience in apiary, facilitated the training. Fifty-four forest adjacent farmers were equipped with skills in beekeeping including:

- Beekeeping fundamentals
- Beehive colonization
- Bee management and feeding
- Beehive maintenance and inspection
- Honey harvesting, royal jelly, and bee venom extraction.

UPDATE ON MOUNT KENYA FIRES AND INTERVENTIONS

In August 2021, a fire broke up near Rutundu in the moorlands of Mt. Kenya. In order to assist identifying priority intervention, an aerial recce was undertaken by Rhino Ark.

The recce identified one critical fire line where all the efforts were focused. If unattended that fire line could have moved to the south-west in a moorland with no road access.

The fire-fighting teams focused on that fire line and succeeded in controlling it. They then moved towards Rutundu Hill where fires that had died off reignited. All fires were controlled.

Teams remained on the ground for a while as there was need to remain vigilant because sometimes fires reignite again due to the prevailing strong winds.

SURVEY ON FOREST IMPACTS CONDUCTED IN RAGATI

Rhino Ark in partnership with Calgary Zoo and the Ragati Forest Partnership conducted a household survey, interviewing local residents around the Ragati and Chehe forest sections to learn more about their relationships with the forest.

During the survey, the team interviewed 200 individuals, including 99 women and 101 men. The team is set to begin the process of analysing the data collected.

This management team conducts regular meetings that bring together all key stakeholders; Kenya Wildlife Service, Kenya Forest Service, Rhino Ark, Community Forest Associations and representative from the national administration to discuss key issues affecting the forest, the fence and adjacent communities.

60KM ELECTRIC FENCE FROM NARO MORU TO RAGATI ALL SET FOR CONSTRUCTION

A leaders' consultative meeting was held at the Kabaru Forest Station to brief all the stakeholders on the upcoming 60-kilometre Mount Kenya Electric Fence project to be built between Naro Moru and Ragati areas of Mt. Kenya.

With support from the UN International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD), the fencing material have already been delivered

to the Mt Kenya National Park headquarters.

Early in 2021, Rhino Ark signed a funding agreement with IFAD and other partners for the Mount Kenya Fence amounting to KES 267 million (\$2.6 million). This includes the construction of 60-km comprehensive fence, three energizer houses, 20 gates, four elephant grids and two years of fence maintenance worth KES 18 million.


Rhino Ark is optimistic that once the short fence is completed, elephants will be contained in the forest where they will not be a nuisance to local communities near the forest.

ABERDARES ECOSYSTEM

APPEAL FOR SUPPORT FOR ABERDARE JOINT SURVEILLANCE UNIT

Rhino Ark's community-based patrol programme needs support.

KES 73,500 (\$735) can cover a two-week field mission deep in our protected forest.

The Aberdare Joint Surveillance Unit (AJSU) is an elite, seven-member team of community scouts that patrols the Aberdare ecosystem. AJSU targets illegal activities such as logging, charcoal kilns, snaring and wildlife trapping. They also monitor wildlife abundance and distribution, gather intelligence and participate in forest fire fighting.

In Eburu, a five-member Foot Patrol Team responds to local intelligence reports and carries out sting operations to catch would-be wildlife or forestry

criminals. Their main targets are wildlife snares, illegal logging and charcoal kilns.

SCHOOLS OF HOPE RECEIVE DONATIONS OF TEXTBOOKS AND SANITARY TOWELS

- Equipped the SOH with sporting equipment and materials. Games such as cricket, rugby, volleyball, football and chess are played.
- Talent development is actively promoted through poetry, drama, music and a beauty pageant.
- Guidance and peer counselling services are offered.
- Sanitary towels are provided to girls under the health programme.
